

What is Millennialism?



Human Government (Genesis 9:1—11:32)


Promise (Genesis 12:1—Exodus 19:25)

Law (Exodus 20:1—Acts 2:4)


Grace (Acts 2:4—Revelation 20:3)

Millennial Kingdom (Revelation 20:4–6)





Millennialism


Millennialism, it must be stressed, is far more than simply believing that the millennium is near. It is a comprehensive way of looking at human history and an integrated system of salvation. It is a type of eschatology, a term derived from Greek for 'doctrine of the last things' or 'end times,' and used to refer broadly to people's ideas about the final events in individual human lives as well as the collective end of human history.

- Belief in an End Times when God judges the living and the dead
- God's goodness reconciles with evil in this world
- Imminent



- Idea has great appeal in every age
- A coming new world
- End to existing institutions of power
- Somewhat revolutionary in that it threatens those in authority



- Gives hope to the suffering
- To some it's a revolt against the present order and an attempt to bring about the promised kingdom of peace
- Driven by sense of imminence as it's coming soon, in our lifetime

 - Main books are Daniel and Revelation


 Apocalyptic literature - literary genre that foretells supernaturally inspired cataclysmic events that will transpire at the end of the world. A product of the Judeo-Christian tradition, apocalyptic literature is characteristically pseudonymous; it takes narrative form, employs esoteric (Intended for or understood by only a small group, especially one with specialized knowledge or interests: synonym: mysterious) language, expresses a pessimistic view of the present, and treats the final events as imminent. -Britannica

 No matter how often apocalyptic beliefs have proved wrong and no matter how much chaos has been caused by millennial efforts to establish God's kingdom on earth, apocalyptic expectations are repeatedly revived – why?



- And many people have died…
- Example I
 - Jewish revolts against Rome in the Ist and 2nd century resulted in several hundred thousand deaths

- British historian Norman Cohn argued that the messianic hope of the Jews was the oldest form of millenarianism known to us (Cohn 1962, 32).
- He cited Daniel 7 as 'a millenarian manifesto which foretells how Israel will overthrow the Greek empire and thereafter dominate the whole world for all eternity.'
- The Syriac Apocalypse of Baruch (or 2 Baruch) 'tells how the messiah will shortly break the power of Rome, exterminate all nations which have ever ruled over Israel and establish a kingdom which will last to the end of the world.'
- He even claimed that the party of the 'zealots,' who precipitated the revolts against Rome, 'was a truly millenarian movement ... convinced of the imminent coming of a supernatural messiah' (Cohn 1962, 32).






Jewish Revolt

- 66 CE—band of Jews revolt against Roman rule
- 70 CE—Romans stormed Jerusalem and destroy Temple Complex, leaving only western portion of the wall (Jew's holiest shrine)
- 73 CE—about a ½ million Jews killed by Romans
- 132 CE—Jews make second attempt at revolt, another ½ million Jews killed
 - Jewish political state ceased to exist (Romans exact complete control)
 - Jewish religion survived, though many driven into exile (dispersal of Jews called *Diaspora*)

 was held in Parseeism.
 - Parsees were Persians who were Zoroastrian and pushed out of Iran by the Muslims in the 7th century to western India





- This concept is expressed in Jewish literature in
 - Enoch, xiii., xci. 12-17; in the apocalypse of the ten weeks
 - Baruch, xl. 3; "And his dominion shall last forever, until the world doomed to destruction shall perish"
 - II Esdras vii. 28-29; Neither here nor in later Jewish literature is the duration of this Messianic reign fixed. It is clear, however, that the rule of the Messiah was considered as a time gap before final judgment
 - Some regarded the Messianic rule as the period of the fulfillment of the prophecies, while others saw in it the time of the subjugation of the nations

• Example 2 of 'and many have died' - Taiping Rebellion, (1850–64) led to 20 million deaths – Hong Xiuquan leader



- Hong's visions convinced him he was the younger brother of Jesus, and he saw it as his duty to free China from Manchu rule
- Led a large-scale rebellion against the Qing dynasty.
- Hong preached the brotherhood and sisterhood of all people under God with common property
- Created a fiercely disciplined army of more than a million men and women who were considered equals
- They captured Nanjing in 1853 and renamed it Tianjing ("Heavenly Capital").
- Their attempts to capture Beijing failed, but an expedition into the upper Yangtze River valley scored many victories.



- Hong's version of Christianity alienated both Western missionaries and the Chinese elite.
- The leadership descended into power struggles that left Hong without competent help.
- In 1860 an attempt to take Shanghai was repelled by U.S.- and British-led forces, and by 1862 Chinese forces under Zeng Guofan had surrounded Nanjing. The city fell in 1864, but almost 100,000 of the Taiping followers preferred death to capture.
- The rebellion ravaged 17 provinces, took some 20 million lives, and left the Qing ineffective
- Both the Chinese communists and the Chinese Nationalists trace their origin to the Taipings.

Example 3 'and many have died' Remember 1978?

An apocalyptic cult, 900 dead: remembering the Jonestown massacre, 40 years on

- Apocalyptic messages seen in every incident or coincidence
- End time promises free believers from fear of authorities and liberates them from all earthly inhibitions

Millennialism defined

Any religious movement that hopes for salvation that is:

- (a) collective, to be enjoyed by all the faithful as a group;
- (b) terrestrial, to be realized on this earth;
- (c) imminent, to come soon and suddenly;
- (d) total, to transform life on earth completely;
- (e) miraculous, to be brought about by, or with the help of, supernatural agencies.
